## If you're stuck....read on!

Great Wall of China: The puzzle is the tea cup pictures and you'll need to look for which one is different. Hint: it's not the size or shape of anything but related to colors. Password is just 1 number.

Statue of Liberty: The puzzle is the list of names that you'll need to identify which one meets all four of the statements below the list. Password is that one name, with a capital letter at the beginning.

Eiffel Tower: The puzzle is to figure out how tall the Eiffel Tower was when it was built. Goggle this, and wikipedia has a chart but it's 1025 feet tall. Cut out and tape together the Eiffel tower to determine which two legs/numbers add to that amount. Password is smaller number,larger number (no spaces).

Egypt: Puzzle is the hieroglyphics puzzle and once you've unlocked the Eiffel Tower puzzle, you'll get the key to decode. Password is that word, all lower case letters.

Machu Picchu: Puzzle is the map with directional key. Start at the arrow and note which direction the path goes. Password is all those directional changes, as all capitals and no spaces (9 total letters).

Sydney Opera House: Puzzle is a code/cipher, which unlocked with the Machu Picchu puzzle, solved by associating the number to that number in the alphabet. Password is the composer's last name, with standard capital letter at the beginning of the name.

Final safe code: Each unlocked puzzle should have given you a digit of the final safe code (total of 6 digits). The Sydney Opera House doesn't give you the number outright, but directions tell you to identify which symphony number it was that the audio clue came from (which was also the first symphony performed at the Sydney Opera House). That information is found in the text when you unlocked the clue.
